

The largest and most southerly of the Channel Islands, Jersey is just 14 miles from the coast of France, giving the island a continental flair. Golden sands, sparkling seas, rugged cliffs, picturesque harbours and fascinating countryside are just a few of the natural attractions that await the visitor to Jersey. Situated on the edge of the Gulf Stream the island slopes from north to south to face the sun and boasts the best sunshine record in the British Isles and a climate which is generally milder in all seasons than the UK.

DAY BY DAY

Monday: We transfer you to your Airport for the short flight to Jersey. On arrival in Jersey you will be transferred to your hotel for check-in.





Friday 14th: We leave in the morning and travel to Hull for the overnight crossing to Zeebrugge. Inside cabins are provided but not meals.

Saturday 15th: We continue our journey to our overnight stay in Germany. Sunday 16th: After breakfast we continue through Germany past Munchen and into Austria, we will then bypass Innsbruck, before crossing over the border into Northern Italy, then on to our resort Fai della Paganella to a warm welcome by our hosts and a glass of Prosecco and admire the stunning mountain views prior to dinner this evening. Wednesday 19th: Today we take a scenic drive to Merano, one of the most beautiful spa towns in the South Tyrol, surrounded by a stunning backdrop of mountains and meadows. Explore the vibrant centre, stroll along the flower lined promenade and perhaps take the chair lift for some fine views. We return via the Adige valley wine route and Lake Caldaro.

Thursday 20th: Today we travel south to the tip of Lake Garda for a visit to the very popular resort of Riva Del Garda, set on the northern point of this beautiful Italian lake. Friday 21st: Our final day in Fai della Paganella and this morning we take a scenic drive into the Trento Valley to visit a local vineyard and enjoy a tasting of some of the fabulous wines this region produce. After allowing time for lunch we return to Paganella for a relaxing afternoon with our hosts.

Saturday 22nd: This morning we start to head for home stopping for an overnight at the Novotel Metz Hauconcourt in France.

Sunday 23rd: After breakfast we will now complete the final leg of our journey as we head north to Calais for our short sailing to Dover.

Please note: These excursions may be swapped around to alternative days with better weather prospects, this will be left to the drivers discretion.

Tuesday 27th: River Rhine Cruise & Drachenfelsbahn - Today we head for Boppard and spend some free time before hopping on board a river cruiser for a cruise from Boppard, upstream through the northern section of the UNESCO protected Upper Middle Rhine Valley, to Oberlahnstein, from where we continue by coach to Königswinter, an historic Rhine Valley town located at the foot of the Siebengebirge Hills. Here we join the Drachenfelsbahn, Germany's oldest cog railway, for a return journey. From the Valley Station to the summit we cover a height difference of 220m and at the top we see the ruined medieval Drachenfels ('dragon's cliff') Castle and great views across the river Rhine. After our time in Königswinter, we return to our hotel by coach.

Wednesday 28th: Cochem & Moselle Cruise - Today we head to the Moselle Valley and the pretty riverside town of Cochem from where we embark on a 1 hour return cruise along the Moselle river, enjoying views of Reichsburg Castle and the surrounding vineyards. After our cruise, we spend the rest of the day in Cochem at leisure, giving us time to explore the Old Town, made up of quaint squares, winding alleys, half-timbered buildings and imposing town gates, watched over by its magnificent 11th century Reichsburg Castle, a Gothic masterpiece which is perched on a rocky outcrop from where fantastic views are to be had.

Thursday 29th: Vulkan Express & Mayschoss Wine Tasting - Today we travel to Brohl for a journey on the Vulkan Express, a unique narrow gauge railway. The line meanders up through the Brohl Valley into the Eifel Hills, whose dramatic rock formations were created during a period of volcanic activity. Opened in 1901, the 11 mile journey takes one and a half hours as the locomotives reach a speed of 20kph, climbing around 1,310 ft! We continue by coach from Engeln to the Ahr Valley, one of Germany's most famous wine growing regions where we visit the charming town of Mayschoss and enjoy wine tasting in one of the town's traditional wine cellars.

Friday 30th: We spend a full day at leisure. You could take the cable car up to the Niederwald Memorial, enjoying the amazing views and exploring the famous Drosselgasse area in the heart of Rüdesheim's old town, sampling a glass of wine along the way **Saturday 31st:** Sadly it's time to leave the beautiful Rhine Valley and head to Rotterdam for our overnight ferry crossing to Hull. 


